

## DigiMacq update July 2011

Intending to visit Parramatta soon to take the DigiMacq tour?

The *Visiting Parramatta* version of the directs you to secret code markers at key sites along the way and some of the markers are not there right now.

You can still enjoy your self guided DigiMacq tour in Parramatta despite the current 'technical difficulties'.

Here are our suggestions, either:

1. select the *Not Visiting Parramatta* option as you download the app from the AppStore. (this will provide you with a straightforward, self guided tour).

2. Do you enjoy a real challenge?  
You and your friends can still download or use the *Visiting Parramatta* version and do the tour together. HINT: check your devices and compare your codes at each site. See which markers are the common ones? Now figure out the sequences to crack the codes, collect a virtual token and get the next set of directions.
